TRUTH BOOTH OPERATOR GUIDE



Truth Booth (TB) operators use this guide because its abundant details are grouped in clusters while pulling participants through a journey few have traveled. Suggestions take the form of to-do and to-get lists. Volunteer activists are encouraged to take ownership of their role. In most locales, the truth movement needs a place like a booth as a hub to attract local activists.

A second version of this guide for owner operators has imbedded video clips aying out the handiwork and how it's done.

STANDARD ISSUES & CONSIDERATION

The standard issue with Truth Booths is that there's too much work to do before its debut. If done alone, that would likely be the case! However, the normal challenge of finding work for volunteers goes away during the preparation stages. When the time for the first “Boother” group to debut arrives, momentum has been built on cooperating in each phase toward completion. Team Spirit has an optimum chance to grow and rise above the norm.

With that, others will want to help. As your first team grows, you can set up secondary teams that enable you to alternate shifts to cover the booth, or host at separate locations.

Location: Will your 10' x 10' Truth Booth fit into the provided area? Is the ground level?

Do you need access to power? If yes, is there a fee and if so, how much is it?

Is there a restroom nearby?

Does everything fit in the available vehicle(s) in one trip? Who could help set it up and break it down?

If you cannot attend an event, you also want a person who can in your stead, navigate conspiracies of the day.

Permits and Fees: Register or apply for any necessary permits, pay appropriate fees, notify the public, and cover all of the basics. You may want to ask about discounts or perks for non-profits, and, if accepting donations is allowed. You may need to contact the local sheriff, fire department, police department, local administrators, or those managing the nearest farmers market, and other top venues with good foot traffic.

Dry Run: Physically put everything together in your yard, a park, or preferably at the actual location a week or two before your first appearance.

A rehearsal builds confidence, morale, and teamwork, and it helps reduce mistakes. It's a good opportunity to bond with and inspire approachable, competent volunteers.

Host a Sneak Preview: Invite friends and truth-friendly folks to see your booth. Turn a regular day or routine evening into an event all will long remember!



Truth Booth Goal & Preparation Phases



Show casing the true history of capital crimes and cover-ups by the U.S. government

- 1) Prepare Lawyers Committee (LC) exhibit sheets for the main display.
- 2) Make hanging exhibit summary columns.
- 3) Prepare banners for canopy attachment.
- 4) Prepare the canopy for a strong bond with banners. Content can include COVID-19/GOFR*/Medical Freedom, 5G, Direct Energy Weapons, Geoengineering, Corporate Capture, Election Integrity and 9/11.

Truth Booth Installation Summary

S-hooks connect exhibit sheets to form vertical columns. The columns are hung from horizontal PVC pipes. The pipes are suspended by wires. The wires are hung from tent frame members overhead that remain stationary (possibly with duct tape). When Truth Booth groups decide where to place their exhibit columns, securing them to the frame stops them from sliding to-and-fro' due to gravity and windy conditions.

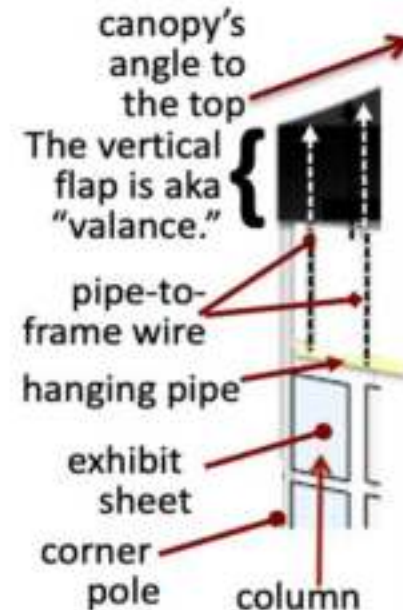
9/11 was over 20 years ago. Why Now?

PHASE 1 -- Print 9/11 Grand Jury Exhibit Summaries

Spec: Landscape layout

MATERIAL: 64 pages of 60-100 lb. 8-1/2 x 11 heavy stock, white/off-white; clear sheet protectors

TOOLS ETC.: Copier, 2 vice grips, hand-held single hole punch

TASK TIME [Phase I tasks] approx. [Minutes in Blue: 300-355](#)

PHASE I: Prep TAP-produced PDF **Grand Jury Exhibit Summaries** (12 of 60 selected) for display.

Copy/print from supplied/emailed PDF from TAP's Truth Booths Program to you.

A.) On the copier scanning glass, place the "**Register Marks**" template. This is where holes for S-hooks will go. The first printing (64 pp.) batch ONLY consists of the four corners with **register marks**. [\[30\]](#)

B.) 2nd print run (64 pp., as 32 twice) **Grand Jury Exhibit Summaries** through the copier **on the exact same sheets of cardstock from A..** [\[30\]](#)

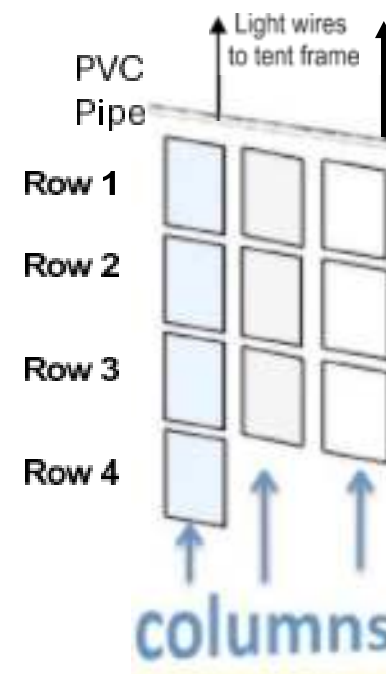
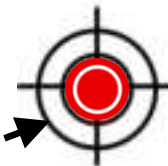
C.) Reinforcing holes (2) at the top of sheets is a decent idea. The bottom holes have a spine beneath them but the top holes cannot. Unreinforced, it takes 25 pounds or more to tear or rip out an S-hook from the top. [\[60-90\]](#)

NOTE 1: Reinforcement patches to the top 2 holes is NOT an absolute. In most circumstances, the combination of two layers of clear sheet, or a single "sleeve" (front + back), plus another middle layer of heavy paper stock normally handles the load. We hung 8 columns for 36 days (24/7) to unreinforced holes we saw very little damage. A couple top sheets in Row 1 had quarter moon dimples from S Hooks. They were, however, kept in play because they looked fine.

If you do want reinforced s-hook holes, start with page 1, Row 1. Then skip to page 5, then 9, 13, 17, 21, 25, 29. These are column top sheets bearing the most weight. To see some detail, go to the mid-center of page 16 (same as "Got torn...?"). Follow those brief, easy directions. Then pop your sheet holes as referred to in A..

NOTE 2: You can also use store-bought, stick-on reinforcements, but the glue adhesive only lasts about a year. [\[150-175\]](#)

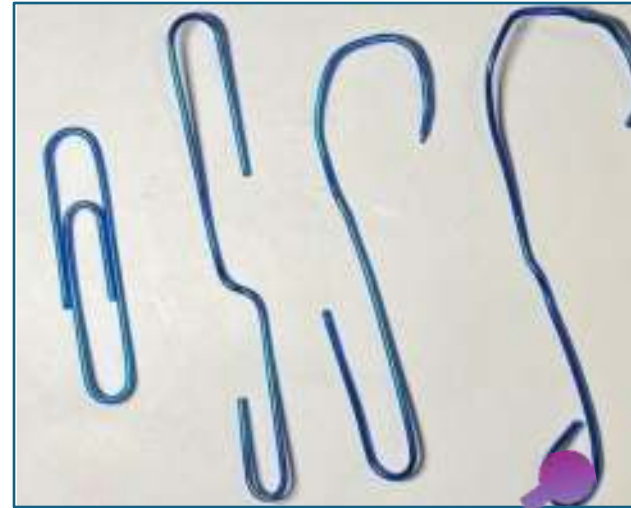
Column Top Hooks



Top hooks are great for strength and flexibility, but they too easily cut through paper.

S-hooks are thicker and they have done a good job under top hooks and at document junctions.

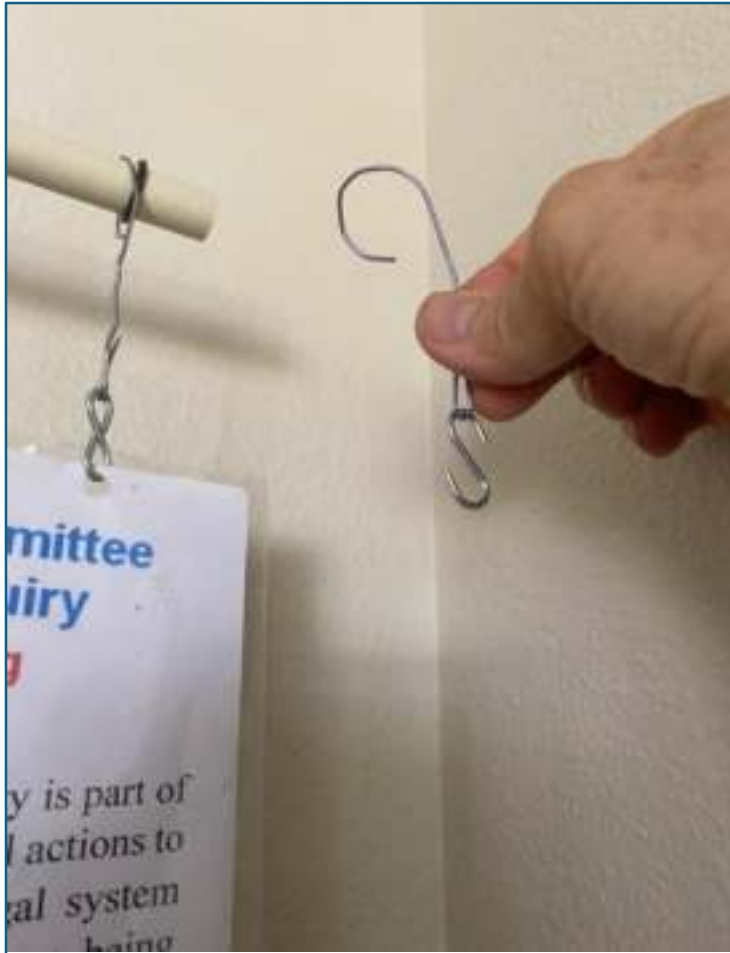
Paper Clip Conversion to Column Top Hook

2 of ½" PVC pipe, (pref. tan-colored), 5-feet each. Remember end caps if filling pipes with sand/water/cement.

TOOLS ETC.: Vice grips (2), single-hole punch, pliers

BUILDING COLUMNS

For Truth Booths, s-hooks are the physical linkages between each court exhibit page of evidence written in summary form. They are the result of studying the 60 exhibits in a federal court petition about 9/11. During set-up, connected columns unfold like an accordion and of course at tear-down, quickly fold into the shopping bag with lots of room for other items. Exhibit sheets go in first, laying flat.



Take -Aways

1. Crimp s-hooks furthest from vice grips' open side for the best fulcrum effect, or leverage.
2. Use vice grips front, center and up close.
3. TIP: when crimping, squeeze the grips firmly but relaxed, like a good, confident handshake.

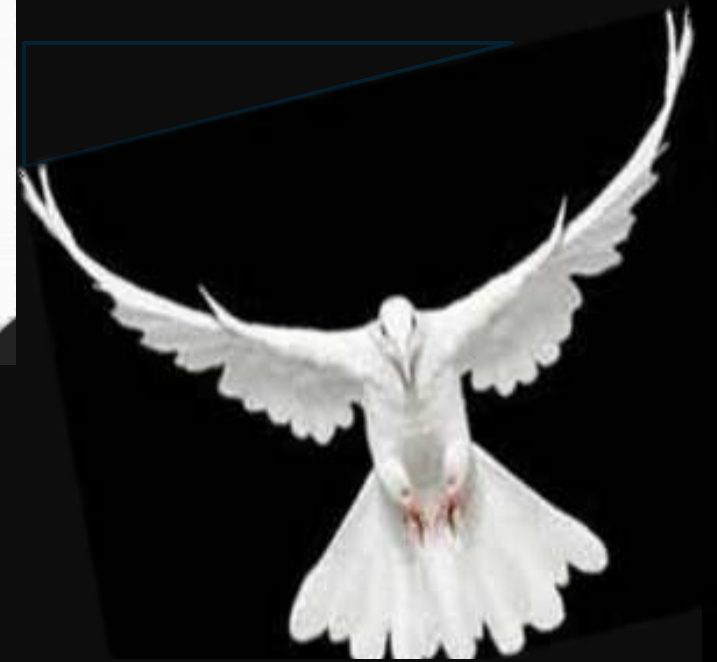

Use sticky tape mapping on your topper/canopy as shown in the following pages.

No harm done, but a bit of overkill here...All or most sticky strips could be cut a half-inch or even one-third inch width because small objects adhere well enough to hang on despite strong wind gusts.

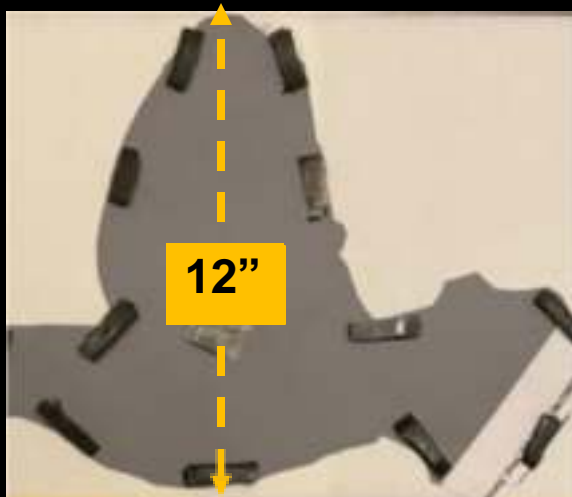

NOTE 1-inch wide strips are not needed with cut-outs, except for our logo on the far right that has four 1"x 1" pieces.

PHASE IV

How to Affix Banners to the Canopy Semi-permanently

- 1) Mark (crayon) exactly where "HOOK + LOOP" spots go on the canopy. Rough-surfaced male hooks belong on top of the softer, fuzzy female loop surface. But at first, they reverse roles.
- 2) Peel off the clear film from male back & stick each on targeted banner spots [previous page].
- 3) Lay same-sized (female) loop strips on top of the prickly, receptive males already affixed to banners.
- 4) Remove the clear film from fuzzy female now with sticky backs. They remain stuck on the males.
- 5) The near-final step is applying Gorilla Fabric Glue (very low V.O.C.'s) in groups to the females backs. That is to say, instead of 1 spot at a time, ramp up to 2, then 3, 5 or 10, or as many as you can in the 2-minute* window.

Depending on size, spots receive 1 to 4 drops of glue. Do not over-apply. Wipe excess glue with a moist towel. Gorilla advises on their label to wait *2 minutes before covering up to get the best bond. After 24-hour cure time, peel BACK the banners 180°. DO NOT PULL them apart (90°). If glue did ooze out, it could pull females off the canopy (This did happen.).

MORE TIPS as Q and A

Q: STUCK: How do we avoid sticky tape sticking (to hands etc.) when we handle it?

A: Put the sticky tape on the top of the index finger nail of your primary hand - not the whole nail, but maybe a quarter-inch at the tip. NOTE by doing all strips together one step at the same time as shown above, "handling" uber sticky material becomes moot.

Q: When a hole is torn and you must fix it, what do you do?

A: This has happened during prep stages but not at a live event. But we do anticipate somewhere, sometime, it will. The task is easy, though. It's on page 18.

NOTICE: Gorilla's Fabric Glue never dries completely. So no worries about mistakes.



Avoid getting "stuck" after removing the clear film from sticky backs. If any MUST be handled, touch them only with fingernails.



Got Torn S-hook Holes?

Using Elmer's Glue All, card stock 'band-aids' fold over exhibit page's top edge, get glued, and lastly, their holes punched again.

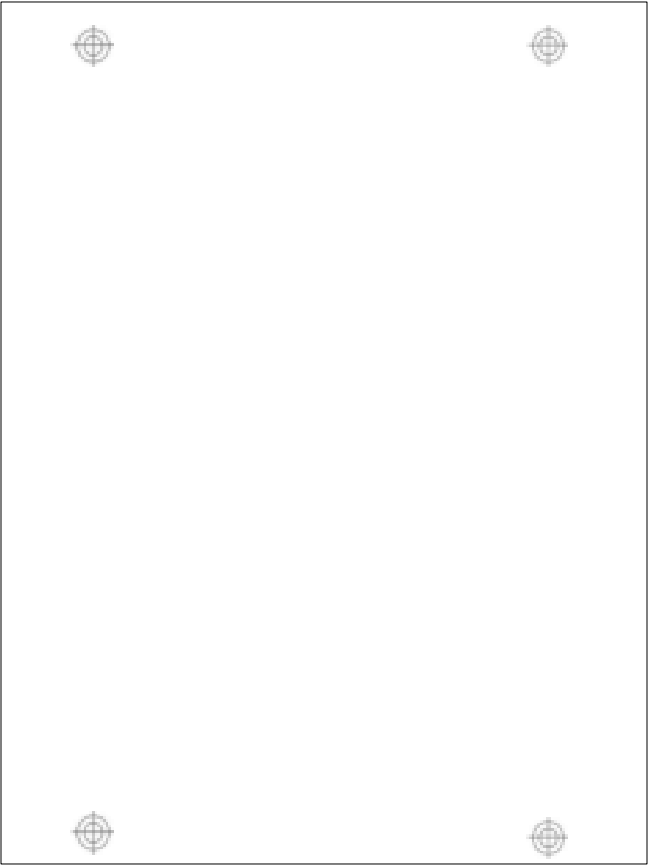

The Building 7 banner is 20 square feet, 2.5' x 8.' With shiny brass grommets and downsized bungee cords that stretch 11 to 16-17 inches, this booth element takes 30 seconds to put up! It hooks up instantly at the 4 corners. An added bonus is the grommet in the top center. **It's** perfect because it stretches up to a canopy strap that seems to be waiting patiently to hook up with a bungee.

Doubles as an eye opener for marches, demonstrations, occupations, highway overpasses or favorite barn-sides. Seriously! After Full Disclosure, this could well be a **collector's** item! But **we MUST WIN first!!**

Print 32 pages x 2 passes

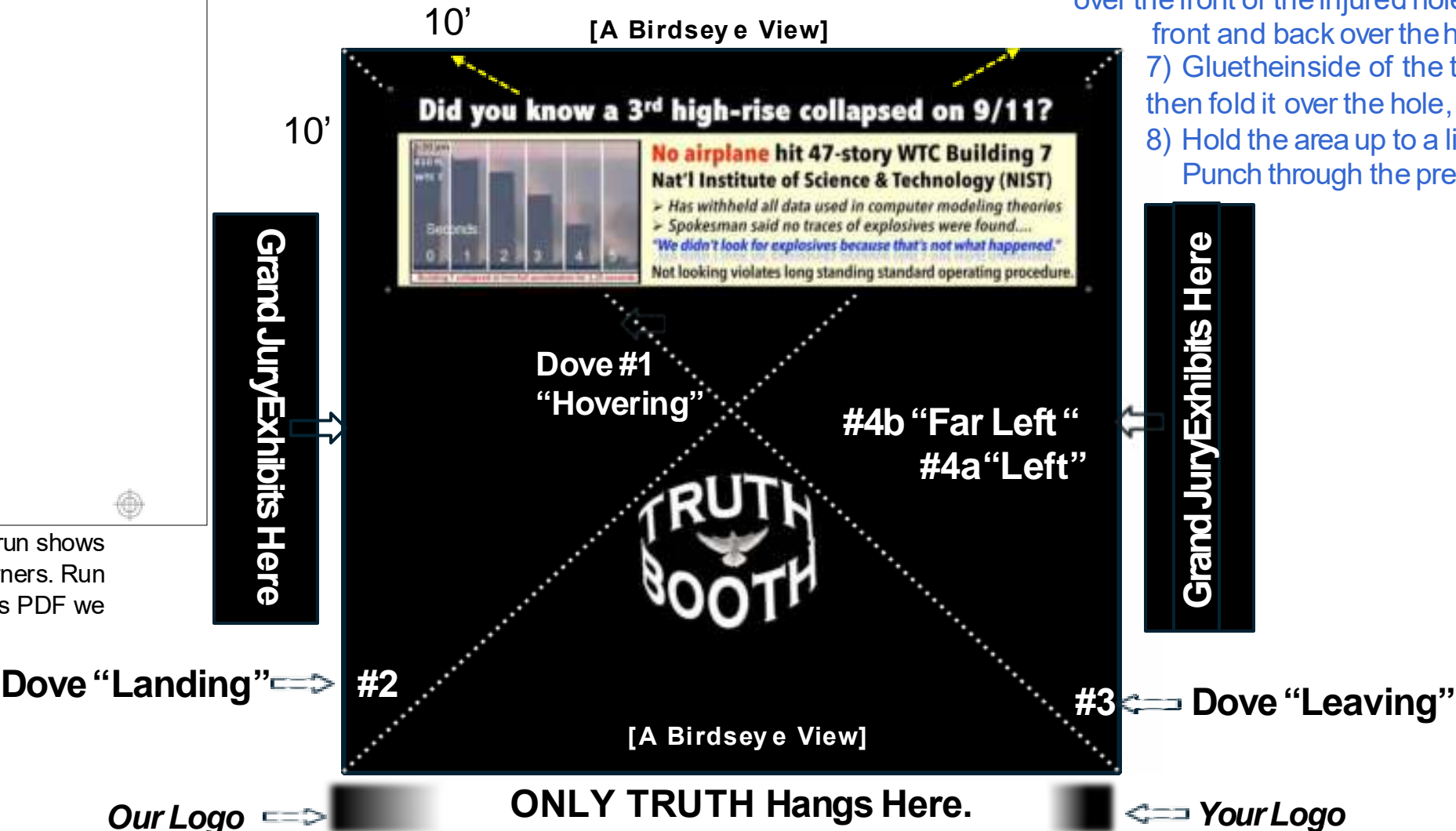


Card stock (32) after 1st print run shows only the marks on the four corners. Run the same sheets of the Exhibits PDF we emailed to your team.

Fixing ripped s-hook holes

- 1) Use card stock paper, 60-lb.+.
- 2) Cut a strip 1/2 inch wide, 6 to 5-1/2 inch long
- 3) Fold the strip twice so that the lengths are the same.

- 4) Cut across the two creases. You now should have three pieces of equal length, about 1-3/4 inches each.
- 5) Fold each of those one time.
- 6) You can now take those tiny tent-shaped reinforcements and place one over the front of the injured holes covering front and back over the hole area.
- 7) Glue the inside of the tiny tent, then fold it over the hole, both sides.
- 8) Hold the area up to a light source. Punch through the previous hole.



Miscellaneous Ideas and Recommendations

Acquire locally or mail-order the following to complete preparation:

8 bricks – 1 per column, for thin wires between the 4th Row's bottom 2 holes, with s-hooks
(1) 10-ft. ½" PVC

Duct or other tape

Consider roping off 1, 2 or 3 sides of the booth.

“WELCOME” mat or signage overhead at entrance

TABLE 2' x 4' up to 3' x 5'

Clipboard and pens for boothers' documents such as petitions etc.

A/V equipment: batteries (perhaps various types for computer/cell phone/lpad etc.)

protective cases, anti-theft:

Attach equipment like retailers featuring select Products

Most devices have some sort of anti-theft software built in, so all you have to mind an account and turn it on

Laptops are questionable (heat, rain, theft). For running video you could procure a refurbished or a many (tech) generations-old screen from Ebay for less (\$50-100). All you really need is enough memory to run a continuous loop, and its power source, of course.



For a buck a brick, take care of most wind-blown concerns. Each sheet's bottom two holes with s-hooks hold thin wire that runs to the brick, attaching to it. Each column gets its own brick.

CAUTION: Prevent “Lift-Off”

Obtain “ankle weights” for (4) outside corner poles using bags/jugs (gallon H₂O = 8.5 lbs.,) sand or ‘clean’ dirt. Tie/cap/close each top, then tie two together. Wrap pairs around the poles until they snuggle into each other. 20- 25 lbs. around each leg will be enough unless wind exceed 30-35 MPH. For aesthetics' sake, use rope or bungee cords to tighten up/wrap up nice and firm around corner ankles.

Northern Florida from early July until mid-August we left an un-bannered booth outdoors to test its durability. During that time rainfall was plentiful with a total of 10-15 inches. Meaning: five or six times a lot of rain collected in the four sections of the frame, and two or three times – the topper bulged 2-3-4 feet downward with 30 to 50 gal. gallons each per section. That's approx. 250–400+ lbs. each, for a conservative total of at least 1,000 lbs... We put that canopy through the wringer! Truth is, we let nature push the limits and one corner eventually did start to rip several inches. Experiment over.

REMEMBER: with gusts 30-35+ MPH, postpone/leave early for another day. Same goes for impermeable ground, with wind over 25 MPH.

TABLING TRUTH BOOTHS

You will want a minimum of two people (three is ideal). One person can staff the table and help with literature handouts, petition signing, TAP member sign-ups, and donations, while the other volunteers actively engage passers-by with printed information or polite discussion.

It's best to divide tabling into shifts so volunteers can take breaks.

Tabling works best when activists step out in front of the table and engage passers-by. High-energy, enthusiastic tablers will have fun, and people will be curious about what's up.

In preparing for your table, first decide on your message. Is it "Join," or "Sign a Lawyers petition," or "Demand a Special 9/11 Grand Jury Investigation?" Have **ONE** or **TWO** things you want people to do. This allows you to be efficient and keeps the public interested and engaged. (A small percentage of people will want to know more and will engage you in lengthy conversation, which is when a third volunteer is helpful.)

Set a goal for your tabling effort. How many signed TAP and LC petitions are you hoping for? How many members do you want to sign up?

What to Bring: A Handy Checklist

- ⌚ Table (one or two folding card tables are ideal) and CHAIRS
- ⌚ Tablecloth or other attractive covering
- ⌚ Banner and/or colorful posters
- ⌚ Literature. Plan your literature based on the tabling goal.
- ⌚ Paperweights, binder clips, rocks or bungee cords stretched across a table to hold down materials to stop them from flying away (Rubber-bands can make it difficult for people to pick up materials.). An action item so people can have the experience of taking action right at the moment: newsletter sign-up, petitions, etc.
- ⌚ Clipboards with pens attached with string or rubber bands (extra pens are useful to have)
- ⌚ Sign-up sheets for new members, volunteers, or e-mail activists
- ⌚ Tape, **especially for securing the wires that suspend hanging pipes on which columns hang.**
- ⌚ Items for donations or give-aways: buttons, bumper stickers, t-shirts, hats, refrigerator magnets
- ⌚ Donation jar (start with a few dollar bills and one or two larger bills)
- ⌚ Cell phone to sign electronically; bookmark: <https://www.911tap.org/join-us/sign-the-petition/>

Preparing Volunteers

It helps to prepare volunteers, especially if new to tabling. Make sure they know the basics about the Lawyers Committee, TAP, and literature. **Email** the ones you want to show/give out beforehand.

Consider role-playing with new volunteers. Pretend to be a passer-by and let them practice what they might say and how to answer a question or two.

A Note About Interacting With the Public: Generally, you will find people are receptive and friendly, or they will simply walk by you. You don't have to engage every person. The "out-front" volunteer should be enthusiastic and engaging, but not aggressive. Some people will want to talk, others will simply want to look at, read, and take literature. Some people may have questions or wish to converse with you. Be friendly and let the public interact with you as they wish. IF you encounter someone who wants to debate or argue -- **Don't!** A loud conversation keeps interested people away. You have opinions, but remain calm and be polite, and use your time efficiently. Spend it with people who want to take action or whose mind can be changed.

2b: Three dove Banners
 : #2 (large) "Landing"
 : #3 (large) "Leaving"
 : #4 (medium) "Left"



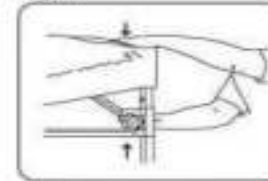
Place tent graphic in center of the area to be sheltered. Have 2 people stand on opposite sides, grasp two outer legs, lift off the ground and step backwards, stopping at arms length.



Grasp at the bottom of the canopy tent on opposite sides, as shown. Lift up and step backwards until tent is fully opened.



Note: For 20' x 10' tent each person should move to middle leg of 20ft side. Grasp bottom of the tent, lift up and step backwards at the same time until tent is fully opened.



Engage the push button at each corner by pushing up with one hand while holding down top of leg with the other hand. Push button will engage in the hole by locking in.



Lift two adjacent outer legs up and pull out the inner legs until snap locks. Repeat on all legs. Raise or level the tent using push button found near bottom of each

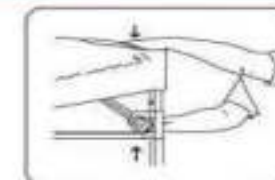
IMPORTANT

Windy Condition - Use stake kit or Sand bags.
Heavy Wind - Take tent down.
Wet Fabric - Let tent dry before closing.
Storage - Use cover bag when not in use.
Rain - Do not leave tent unattended.

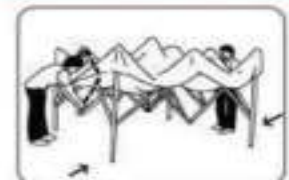
Closing instructions



Lift outer legs slightly, then depress the push button to release pressure on slider. Repeat on opposite side.



Release push button at each corner to release pressure on slider. Repeat on all four corners.



Grasp top of the tent on opposite sides. Lift and shake the tent. Step forward towards your partner until the tent is 3/4 closed. Grasp two outer legs, push together till tent is fully closed.

On June 11, 1776 while the question of independence was being debated, the visiting Iroquois chiefs were formally invited into the meeting hall of the Continental Congress. There a speech was delivered, in which they were addressed as "Brothers" and told of the delegates' wish that the "friendship" between them would "continue as long as the sun shall shine" and the "waters run." The speech also expressed the hope that the new Americans and the Iroquois act "as one people, and have but one heart." [18] After this speech, an Onondaga chief requested permission to give Hancock an Indian name. The Congress graciously consented,

and so the president was renamed "Karanduan, or the Great Tree." With the Iroquois chiefs inside the halls of Congress on the eve of American Independence, the impact of Iroquois ideas on the founders is unmistakable. History is indebted to Charles Thomson, an adopted Delaware, whose knowledge of and respect for American Indians is reflected in the attention that he gave to this ceremony in the records of the Continental Congress.
